Frequently Asked Questions

What is the cost to attend monthly meetings?

Monthly meeting cost is \$35 per person (except for the Executive Night event where cost varies, typically \$50 per person). This cost covers meal, speaker and program-related incidentals for the evening. Most firms pay this expense for their representative(s).

Where are meetings held?

Monthly Birmingham Chapter meetings are held at various locations in the Birmingham metro area. Date, time and locations are sent to all representatives in the monthly newsletter and individual meeting invitations are sent to all representatives via email.

When are meetings held?

Most meetings are held the 3rd Tuesday evening of each month. Exceptions may be the months of November and December, and we may host an occasional luncheon instead of an evening meeting.

Meetings typically begin at 5:00 pm (networking time), 5:30 pm (dinner) followed by a program or business meeting and conclude around 7:00 - 7:30pm.

We also offer and encourage other gatherings, whether small groups who want to get together after work, or organized groups working together for community efforts.

- EWI members consist of employed business professionals at all levels of business.
- Membership is available to member firms and individuals.
- Members join at the Chapter and Corporate level simultaneously.
- EWI dues are assessed annually and are comprised of both national and local Chapter dues.
